They were nominated by the Suicide Prevention Manager from West Midlands Trains as follows:

"Thanks for your staffs intervention today, the actions of staff have almost certainly saved a serious incident at the station. The staff should be very proud of their actions today and they have made a real difference."

The Incident Log Reports as follows:

"While at University working on Platform 2 barriers at approx. 9am, I, Ryan Tidman heard a train sound its horn just outside the station. As I made my way out onto the platform, I noticed an IC1 female on the track. I shouted at her to get off the track as she made her way up onto the platform. I then shouted at my colleague to keep hold of her and then told two West Midlands Revenue Protection Officers what I had seen.

The two West Midlands staff and I made our way over to Platform 1, where we met the girl and informed the on-duty Manager. BTP were called and took a statement from myself. The female was spoken to by BTP and it was decided that no further action was necessary."

Ryan and Emeka are highly commended for their professionalism and initiative in preventing a potentially serious incident.

"We attended the D-Day 80 event in Portsmouth today with some military veterans. We were seated on one of the accessible platforms where one of your contractors, Aaron was working. He was cheerful, helpful and respectful throughout, which was great.

She jumped behind the desk with the only available NWR staff (Tajah), together displaying a professional attitude under pressure. It would have been a very difficult day without her. "Special thanks towards all the Response Team, especially Osman Sow & Sam Okello, whom last night when we were closing the station dealt with a young female who kept running towards the tracks and potentially suicidal."

Their Manager wrote, "Osman Sow and Sam Okello have both worked nights on the response team for a long time and have always been reliable team players, they did a great job stopping this vulnerable young girl from potentially attempting suicide. Some might say this is part of the job, however the adrenaline rush having a young persons safety and future in your hands would be beyond any expectation of any job. Well done to both of them."

The were called by station staff to assist with the vulnerable female and assisted them and ambulance staff to calm the lady in question. She later attempted to run to the platform and they had to chase after her and detain her. The MPS arrived and took over dealing with her.
